

Did you know?



Burleigh's Petroglyphs

The "discovery" of the Petroglyphs in the 1950s brought renewed interest to the area. Many local settlers and cottagers had hiked, picnicked and marvelled at the rock carvings for years before they were acknowledged in 1956 by Dr. Kenneth Kidd.

A major study in 1967 by Prof. Joan Vastokas of the University of Toronto served to recognize the site as one of the earliest rock carvings to be found in North America. The hundreds of carvings of symbolic shapes and figures, having deep spiritual meaning, are estimated by Archeologists to have been carved by Algonkian-speaking Aboriginal people between 500 and 1,000 years ago. The area surrounding the site was established as a Day Use Ontario Provincial Park in 1976. A specially designed protective building was constructed over the main body of the Petroglyphs in 1984. Recently expanded interpretive programs at these "Teaching Rocks" are being offered to the public. The Curve Lake Band Council oversees the interpretation and preservation of the Petroglyph site.

The Petroglyph Provincial Park Protective Building opened on May 7, 1985.
