THE BRIDGE REPORT

The answer to last month's question is that *six hearts doubled* wins the hand. When the doubler is sitting with the Ace of trump and Ace of clubs, he leads with the Ace of clubs and your partner's cards go on the table. They have a King and four Clubs remaining, while you have none, so you trump the Club Ace, and draw trump losing only one to the Ace of Hearts. Your team collects 1,210 points, or 1,660 if you are vulnerable.

I'm finding that since we only play once or twice a week, players are forgetting to watch out for the high-low signal when on defense, also returning a partner's lead, especially in no trump. Do not lead an Ace from an Ace xxx. Do not be afraid to lead a

trump, especially if there is only one on the table. That way, it cannot be used to trump a loser in the bidder's hand. Remember to always have fun.
