Replacement Projected for NK's Hidden Beauty



bove is Doug Field's photo of the wonderful 66 Year old bridge, crossing Eels Creek on Highway 28 at Haultain, which is one of the final few remaining wooden bridges in Ontario supporting a major highway. It was built in 1952 and the Apsley Voice has learned that it will soon be replaced with a new, two lane, single-span, steel girder bridge set to last 75 years.

During this construction project, two-way traffic will be maintained on the existing bridge. Then, the highway

will be re-alligned to line-up with the new bridge, which will be ten meters to the east of the existing roadway.

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has engaged a contractor, AECON, to proceed with a Detail Design of this project and they invited public input until February 7, 2019. Previous estimates of this design were \$50K and the bridge replacement was estimated at half a million dollars. For more information, go to the NK website and search for Eels Creek Comment Form.
