HELPING THE BIRDS

October, 2019, will be the last edition of the Apsley Voice until Spring, 2020. Happy holidays, everyone! We all appreciate the Apsley Voice to keep us up-to-date on Apsley news. Here are a few reminders to our readers re helping our birds at this time of year as well as over the winter.

Firstly: Hope that you will keep your feeders full and scatter seeds on the ground for the birds that feed there. Migrating birds need lots of food to create the energy to fly south - some, thousands of miles!

Secondly: We leave our Hummingbird feeders full into November for the few stragglers. They come by, stay a day or two, thankful that they finally have food. Frost, by then, has killed all the flowers.

Thirdly: Especially young birds migrating south, have not had to deal with reflections in windows - that is, a window reflects where they have come from so they think that they should keep on flying. They bang into that window and are probably killed. To stop this, we put screws on the outside of the four corners of the window and stretch cotton netting across the window, hooking it onto the four screws. Sometimes a bird hits the netting but is safely bounced back - or sees the netting and puts on the brakes. No casualties or injuries since we started this.

Fourthly: Migrating birds go south much more slowly than in the Spring when they are concentrating on establishing a nesting area; finding a mate; having a family - so they may be easier to identify. The catch is, they usually molt their old, worn-out feathers and grow new ones of a different colour - there is no reason to look handsome or beautiful - mating is over. Their new feathers blend in with their surroundings, making them more invisible.

Have a wonderful time this Fall and Winter in the World of Birds!
