Ideas to Plan for Fishing in the Fall

It's that time of year again when the children go back to school; the days get shorter and cooler and most anglers stop fishing.

After Labour Day, there is a marked difference in the amount of fishing boats on the water or shore anglers. The fall is usually one of the best times to fish. Some of those good looking fishing spots that were always cluttered with Sea Do's are now wide open. And, most important, most fish species are bulking up for the long winter lay over. Their aggressive feeding is triggered by both the reduction of daylight and the cooling waters. Keep in mind you may notice this pattern start sooner in the shallower lakes that tend to cool faster and end later in some of the deeper lakes that cool slower.

Fish holding locations tend to change also. They start moving out of the deeper pools that were cooler in summer to the shallower depths that have started to cool down in search of forage. Keep an eye on the weeds. Fish tend to hang more around oxygen emitting green weeds, then carbon dioxide emitting dying, brown weeds as we head later into fall.

As the water cools even more, you may be wise to reduce your presentation size and speed of retrieval. Anglers who ice fish in the winter use tiny; hooks, minnows and lures. Keep the elements in mind also. It gets dark sooner and sooner every day. You may start with nice warm fall day, but if a north wind starts to blow across the wide open lake, it will feel down right cold, so dress appropriately. A thermos full of hot coffee or tea, even on shore, will be a lot more welcome to most - than a cold drink.


